A. PURPOSE

The TCIAA seeks to engage a qualified contractor to manage and maintain the airside vegetation at JAGS McCartney International Airport (JMIA), ensuring safety and aesthetics. The goal is to ensure compliance with aviation safety standards, minimize wildlife hazards, and maintain clear visibility and accessibility on airport grounds. By outsourcing these tasks, JMIA aims to enhance the appearance of the airport, optimize operations, and maintain a safe and well-managed aerodrome for aircraft.

B. COMPANY BACKGROUND

The TCIAA is a statutory body established in 2006 following the split of the Civil Aviation Department into the Civil Aviation Authority and Airports Authority. TCIAA is mandated for the constructing, controlling, and managing of airports; providing and maintaining runways, taxiways, and terminals for the efficient operation of airports; providing facilities for Customs and Immigration Services, and Health and Security checks; and for incidental and associated purposes.

C. SCOPE OF SERVICES

Detailed information regarding the specific areas covered under this scope of services can be found in Appendix 1. The tasks include:

1. VEGETATION MANAGEMENT

Vegetation Height Management:

- o Routine mowing and trimming of all grass, weeds, and shrubs areas maintaining a height of 3 to 3.5 inches.
- Perform bi-weekly mowing or as required based on seasonal growth patterns
- Use appropriate mowing equipment that minimizes Foreign Object Debris (FOD) risks.

Weed Control & Brush clearing

- Apply environmentally approved herbicides to control invasive plant species
- Remove overgrown vegeation around runways, taxiways, signage and lighting.
- o Ensure clear zones around navigation aids and perimeter fencing.





 Maintain a vegetain-free buffer zone of 1-3 meters along perimeter fencing.

Key Areas

- Runway Strip & Shoulders to maintain safe aircraft operations and visibility.
- Taxiways & Shoulders
- Airfield Perimeter Fence Line to maintain clear sightlines for security and wildlife management.
- Drainage Systems Preventing blockages that could lead to water pooling and erosion.
- Navigational Aids (NAVAIDs) & Lighting Systems Clearing around approach lights, PAPI and signage's to ensure visibility and functionality.
- Windsock & Weather Monitoring Stations clear area for accurate wind and weather readings.
- Emergency Access Roads Ensuring these routes remain accessible at all times for emergency response.
- Approach and Departure Paths Vegetation in these zones must be controlled to maintain obstacle-free approach and departure corridors, preventing obstructions to aircraft on takeoff or landing

2. RUNWAY SWEEPING

Areas to be swept

- o Runways
- o Taxiways
- Apron Areas

Frequency/ Scheduling

Sweeping operations must be coordinated with Air Traffic Control (ATC) to avoid disruptions.

- Remove dust, sand, gravel, metal fragments, rubber deposits, and other foreign objects.
- Post-Adverse Weather Sweeping: Conducted after heavy rains, strong winds, or storms.
- Emergency Sweeping: As needed after construction activities, aircraft incidents, or FOD alerts.

3. **REPORTING:**

 Submit monthly reports on work perfromed, issues encountered and recommendations for improvements.





4. LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE:

- Conduct regular checks and maintenance of the existing irrigation system to ensure optimal functioning.
- o Replacement of dead or damaged plants with approved species as needed.
- Regular removal of fallen leaves, branches, and other debris from landscaped areas.

5. ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:

- o Remove all trash prior to moving each session.
- o Ensure leaf removal from the turf as required, keeping all areas clean at all times.
- o Proper disposal of all green waste generated during the course of the work.

Additional Services:

- Ability to provide vegetation management services in response to emergency situations (e.g., storms, rapid overgrowth).
- o Adjust maintenance schedules and practices to accommodate seasonal changes and ensure year-round quality.

The contractor will be fully responsible for all vegetation maintenance on the airside of JAGS McCartney International Airport (JMIA).

The contractor will be subjected to sit a mandatory General Security Awareness Training (GSAT) session and upon successful completion will be issued a TCIAA badge.

PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

At a minimum, the Proposer shall include in its proposal the information outlined below to demonstrate their competence and qualifications for the satisfactory performance of the services specified in this RFP. This information should serve as a guide to showcase both the Proposer's and their company's capability to effectively fulfill the scope of services.

1. Statement of Qualifications:





- a. The Proposer shall provide a cover letter expressing interest in the project and providing a brief overview of their experience in developing projects of a similar size, scope, and complexity as required by this RFP.
- b. The Proposer must complete and submit either of the KNOW YOUR CUSTOMER ("KYC") FORM based on your classification as described in Appendix B, along with supporting documents.
- c. The Proposer must complete and signed the CERTIFICATE OF NON-COLLUSION. No proposal will be considered unless this is submitted.

2. Methodology

The proposal should include a detailed plan outlining how the contractor intends to execute the scope of work, including a breakdown of labor and equipment costs. Additionally, it should describe practices to ensure environmental responsibility, demonstrating how the contractor will adhere to environmental compliance requirements. The proposal should include of list of all equipment that will be used to carry out the task, list whether the equipment is owned or rented.

3. Work Plan

The proposer must submit a detailed timeline or work plan outlining project schedule for a one (1) year period. This schedule should demonstrate the proposed duration and equipment required for the completion of the specified works as outlined in the Scope of Services above.

4. Complete Project Pricing

The proposal should include a detailed cost breakdown for the services outlined in the scope of work, along with the proposed payment terms and conditions.

D. <u>SELECTION PROCESS</u>

All proposals will be reviewed and assessed based on, but not limited to:

- Technical Competence (30%) Demonstrated experience and expertise.
- Compliance & Safety (20%) Adherence to aviation safety and environmental standards.
- Project Approach (20%) Effectiveness of proposed work plan and methodology.
- Cost Effectiveness (20%) Competitive and reasonable pricing.





• References & Past Performance (10%) – Positive feedback from previous contracts

The TCIAA reserves the right to reject a non-responsive proposal that does not include the documents required to be submitted by this RFP.

The TCIAA reserves the right to request clarifications or additional information from any or all Proposers regarding their proposals.

The TCIAA also reserves the right to negotiate the agreement with the highest-ranked Proposer's terms and conditions, including the final price.

APPENDIX A – AERIAL VEIW OF SERVICE LOCATION



This appendix provides an aerial view of the service locations at JAGS McCartney International Airport (JMIA), highlighting the key areas where vegetation maintenance services are required. The following areas of concern are identified for attention and management:

- (i) Runway Strip & Shoulders
- (ii) Taxiways & Shoulders
- (iii) Airfield Perimeter Fence Line
- (iv) Drainage Systems
- (v) Navigational Aids (NAVAIDs) & Lighting Systems Clearing around approach lights, PAPI and signage's to ensure visibility and functionality.
- (vi) Windsock & Weather Monitoring Stations -
- (vii) Emergency Access Roads Ensuring these routes remain accessible at all times for emergency response.
- (viii) Approach and Departure Paths Vegetation in these zones must be controlled to maintain obstacle-free approach and departure corridors, preventing obstructions to aircraft on takeoff or landing
