





About TCIAA

The Turks and Caicos Islands Airports Authority (TCIAA) is an organization set up by the Government of the Turks and Caicos Islands in 2005 to control and manage all public airports within the islands.

This includes providing and maintaining runways, taxiways and terminal buildings for aircraft and passenger facilitation.

During the fiscal year, 2010-2011 the Government of the Turks & Caicos Islands ("TCIG") transferred 8,050,000 shares, representing its 35% shareholding in Providenciales Airport Company Limited ("PAC"), to the Authority at no cost. On 19th April 2010, the Authority acquired 100% of the assets and operations of Provo Airport Company (PAC) for thirty million United States dollars (\$30,000,000.00).

As part of the agreement, the Authority acquired the Providenciales International Airport's terminal building, apron, and lighting, as well as Grand Turk Airport's building (along with fittings), runway, and taxiway.

This was a significant milestone as it marked the return of valuable national assets to the people of the Turks and Caicos Islands. Today, the TCIAA continues to operate as a focal point on the national agenda for economic and social development. The TCIAA Board consists of eight (8) members with a broad spectrum of experience in airport management, aviation, security, development, investment, law, and other industries, as well as public policy and government.

The goal of the TCIAA is to provide world-class airport operations through high-standard safety, security, quality, efficiencies, and customer service, recognizing its importance to the overall economic development and strategic growth of the Turks and Caicos Islands.

Since its inception, the TCIAA has been instrumental in the development of airports that connect the Turks and Caicos Islands to the rest of the world.

Following a remarkable nationwide economic recovery in the aftermath of COVID-19, the TCIAA is improving and revitalizing its facilities, improving airline relationships, and trying to establish routes to grow the demands of the islands.



Coral Reef System

The Turks and Caicos Islands is home to one of the best barrier reefs in the world, and probably the second finest reef system in the tropical Atlantic (after the Mesoamerican Barrier Reef System off the Yucatan and Belize).

Water Sports

Diving and snorkeling in the Turks and Caicos Islands is
like none other and the islands are equipped with several
experienced local dive operators licensed to take visitors
through a PADI-certified course (i.e. Dive Certification courses).
The vast options for water sports available throughout the
Turks and Caicos Islands include kiteboarding, wakeboarding,
parasailing, windsurfing, Hobie Cat sailing, kayaking, paddle
boarding, and eco tours through mangroves and shallow
flats of nature reserves, allowing visitors an excellent view
of the local seal life and birds.

Sport Fishing is also prominent reason for visiting the Turks and Caicos Islands and every year many flock to the island of Providenciales to participate in the international Caicos Classic bill fishing event held in Turtle Cove Marina. Bonefishing is also a prominent activity amongst adventure seekers, and the extensive flats near Middle Caicos, South Caicos, East Caicos and Ambergris Cays is world-class.



Prime For New Routes and Opportunities

The Turks and Caicos Islands ("TCI") has much to offer for luxury and/or adventure seeking tourists and potential investors. The economy is primarily dependent on its remarkably sustainable niche tourism industry and has an airport network that eases connectivity between the main islands. Tourist and investors benefit from access to these treasured islands from one of four designated public international airports and three luxury and highly reputable Fixed Based Operators (FBOs).

Once, considered the world's best-kept secret, each island, and cay in the archipelago is a destination on its own, welcoming visitors to pristine and inviting beaches, luxurious accommodations, world-class spas, delectable dining, water-based and eco-centric excursions, culture, and local traditions. Today, the islands are renowned for their reputation as the ultimate luxury vacation spot, frequented by celebrities, creatives, thrill seekers, families, and those in need of a peaceful retreat alike.

The primary vacation attraction to the islands is the country's exquisite marine environment and unparalleled beaches. The TCI is acclaimed for its exceptional scuba diving and is home to one of the finest barrier reefs in the Atlantic Ocean. As a counterpart to luxury tourism, the real estate and investment markets in the TCI have significantly grown in recent years.

Like many tourism destinations, the TCI experiences predictable peaks and falls in visitor arrivals throughout the year. The winter (high season) is the business time of year. International Brands

Luxury brand interest continues to expand, with the IHG brands: Intercontinental, Kimpton and Indigo being the latest brands added to the Turks and Caicos hotel industry. The Marriot has expanded its footprint as it lends its name to the Salterra Resort in South Caicos. There has been a notable increase in interest beyond the North American hotel brands as we have expanded the brand portfolio to include an ultraluxury South American brand. Noteworthy also is the expansion and interest in European brands looking to join TCI shores.

Unit count projections for the next decade suggest a significant increase, with an anticipated growth of approximately 90%. This expansion nearly doubles the current Unit count of 4,647, as reported in the 2020 Tourist Board Report. If these projections hold, the number of available rooms will rise substantially, reflecting the country's strong potential for tourism growth. This growth is driven by increased demand, new developments and strategic efforts to enhance the country's luxury brand and positioning to attract strategic investors and generate a more significant economic impact.



Project Value by Island

This year, the investment portfolio diversified from the traditional resort development with projects such as Hamilton Education Fund (HEF) - a medical school; Primitive Greens - a hydroponic farm; and Island Organics - a candle/cosmetic factory. HEF also introduced an innovative financing mechanism, as opposed to loans and private financing. The financing strategy proposes to openly market and sell shares in the development company to finance the medical school. Fremantle Ltd., a movie production company, also differed from the traditional brick-and-mortar resort development.

Refurbishments are essential in maintaining and enhancing the quality and appeal of the TCI product, ensuring that it remains competitive in the global market. Recognising the importance of these upgrades, refurbishment projects valued at \$36 million were approved for support. These projects will not only preserve the high standards that visitors expect from the TCI experience but also contribute to the longterm sustainability and attractiveness of the destination. By investing in these refurbishments, the TCI maintains its reputation as a premier destination and ensures that its facilities and accommodations continue to meet and exceed the expectations of new and returning visitors.

The Investor Services Unit has been instrumental in driving economic growth in the Turks and Caicos Islands, managing 49 projects valued at \$3.8 billion in the 2023-24 financial year. These efforts create significant employment opportunities and value-added services in the country.

Projections for the next 10 years show a substantial increase in room count and employment. While some major development projects are not facilitated by Invest Turks and Caicos and are therefore excluded from our projections, Invest TCI is currently managing 95% of the total value of major ongoing investment projects, according to data from the Planning Department.

PRIMARY OPERATIONS

Primary operations are currently for domestic travel between other islands within the Turks and Caicos Islands.

Severely damaged during the 2017 hurricanes Irma and Maria resulted in significant restrictions on landing and operations. International status restored 30th July 2019 as a result of refurbishments undertaken to bring airport back up to operational code.

The Big South

Once an economic center of the Turks and Caicos Islands, South Caicos ("the Big South") is the last to the southeast and the smallest main island of the Caicos archipelago. Rich with history, and with a scene lined with Salinas and weathered salt warehouses build from hand-cut limestone blocks, the island is a laid back paradise reserved for the adventurous and yet reserved.

Lauded by CNN as a "Sleepy island waking up to laid-back luxury" the island is home to three national parks and reserves which offer spectacular reefs for snorkeling and diving. Conscious of its awakening and reality as a burgeoning tourism destination in its own right, a new 29,150 square foot commercial passenger terminal is currently under construction and is scheduled to open in January 2023.

There are currently two exceptional resorts on the island coupled with several homestays and private villas, with several other accommodation options currently planned and awaiting the delivered hope of commercial passenger terminal. Thus, there are opportunities for airlines to seize first options in providing a scheduled international service to this diving hot-spot.



Norman B. Saunders International Airport - XSC

South Caicos, also known as the "Big South" is slated to become the next "Big Thing" in the Turks and Caicos Islands. Historic Hurricanes and other events resulted in complete destruction of passenger terminal and fence line, resulting in the Airport being removed from regulated international commercial services and very restricted domestic services.



The Twin Garden Islands

North Caicos and Middle Caicos are the twin "Garden islands" of the Caicos archipelago. Day to day life on these islands is laid back and quiet, however, with extensive wetland systems, the islands provide the TCI's finest natural tourist attractions which include caves, blue holes, and spectacular limestone cliffs.

The two islands are connected by a scenic causeway and North Caicos is just a thirty (30) minute ferry ride from Providenciales. Many visitors take a day trip from Providenciales to experience the wetlands of North Caicos and to get Instagram-able views of Middle Caicos' majestic coastline, however, in recent years North Caicos has established itself as a popular tourism destination in its own right with there being recent and ongoing high valued investments in the construction of luxury resorts and villas across both isles.

There is a strong and increasing demand for the resumption of scheduled domestic flight services into North Caicos along with an FBO purposed for accommodating international general aviation. As a result the TCIAA is committed to redeveloping the airfield and passenger terminal at North Caicos and has commenced preliminary works to charter a project timeline.

We are also currently entertaining proposals for a private partnership in the development of the Airport and/or proposals for a private FBO development.



Clifford Gardiner International Airport - NCS

The Turks and Caicos Islands Airports Authority (TCIAA) is working to restore air traffic to the Green Isle of North Caicos.

We are also accepting proposals for the construction of an FBO. The short-term goal is to reopen the Clifford Gardiner International Airport for domestic air traffic.

Plans are to resurface the runway, and complete the perimeter fence.
